Open to any garden society including U3a groups, individuals 'five bulbs give away' **To be** displayed in 30cm Container

Class 42a: Five bulbs in a container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter Class 42b: HGS five bulbs in a container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter

To be displayed in 30cm & See Class 46 a - 20cm only

Class 43 A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter, of daffodils grown by the exhibitor Class 44a Five tulips any one variety of cut stems in a vase Class 44b A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter, of one variety tulips Class 44c A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter, of mixed variety tulips Class 45a A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter of three hyacinths Class 45b A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter of five hyacinths Class 46a A container, not exceed 20 cm in diameter of single amaryllis Class 46b A container, other bulbs and corns, not exceed 30 cm for one variety

Herbaceous Plant Section

Class 47: Three different hardy cut flowers from any species or variety of herbaceous or bulbous plant (shrubs, daffodils, tulips, or narcissus excluded)

Class 48: One pot plant in flower grown in house owned by exhibitor for at least six months Class 49: Stems from one hardy flowering tree, shrub, or climber

Class 50: Stems from three hardy flowering trees, shrubs, or climbers. To be exhibited in separate containers. Exhibitors provide their own containers.

Class 51 A container, not exceed 30 cm in diameter of single cactus
